Year in Review

This year RJCA received 78% more <u>youth cases</u> than last year.

The number of youth who completed the program increased by 81% (94 in FY16 vs. 52 in FY15)


On the journey toward more criminal justice alternatives, RJCA



SYSTEMS ENGAGED

In collaboration with the Minneapolis City Attorney's Office and the Minneapolis Police Department, RJCA began a new diversion program – called Interact – for adults cited for obstruction of justice and related offenses. During the Interact meeting, an RJCA staff person facilitates a discussion between the participant and an MPD representative. In the discussion parties talk about the obstruction incident and what each party could have done better, police practices and reform initiatives, and police-community relations. In four months, twenty participants have attended an Interact meeting and the feedback on the process has been very positive.


